I thank you for your good letter of July 2nd. I am submitting the suggestion you make to the other bureau managers concerned and as soon as I have their reply I will immediately let you know. In the meantime please hold the time for us, January 25 to April 3, inclusive.

I am glad you like the lecturing in Chautauquas there in the west. Am pleased to hear what you say concerning the reception you are receiving when you advocate the League of Nations. The fight is now on in earnest. I think the Senate made an admirable address to the Senate yesterday, provided of course he follows this up now with a definite and detailed exposition of the workings of the League and the Peace Treaty.
