Dear Miss Giles:

I am sending you the revision of Number Four. The principle changes are those made by Mr. Swope himself and touch only certain details of the unemployment insurance feature of his plan.

Mr. Burton's copy suggested that other unemployment insurance plans be touched upon. They are too meagre to be impressive in a scheme which covers so thoroughly the matter of taking care of workers as the Swope Plan does. There are all told only about eleven in the country - all told these eleven cover about eleven thousand employees, nine of these plans were in existence when Mr. Swope put his before the G. E. workers. I have made a paragraph giving what seems to me the essential information, but of course this could be expanded in a footnote, that is, all the eleven firms could be named together with the date of their adoption of their plans. This seems a little too detailed for me for an article of this kind. What think?
