
The central thought of this campaign is to encourage law observance on the part of Christians, as contrasted with law enforcement. We feel that the Christian's first duty is to see that he and his immediate family are observing the laws, both for their own sakes and the sake of the example created. That this has struck a very needed and popular chord is evidenced by the letters we are receiving from Governors of States, Presidents of colleges, and leading men and women in every order of life.

As your name is one of those proposed for membership on the Advisory Board of the "Christian Conscience Crusade," we would be greatly pleased and honored by your assent to this proposition.
