
Dear Miss Tarbell:-

In view of your interest in our attempts to adjust ourselves to changing conditions - we might say, changing ideals - I am presuming to hand you copy of personal letter addressed to Senator Copeland of New York in regard to the Wagner Bill and would sincerely appreciate your comment.

It seems to me that the Bill as drafted reflects cleverness rather than mental honesty. The intimidation clause might at least have applied to both sides of the fence. I feel that no legislation that has been offered to date has so aroused suspicion of the New Deal itself, or so inspired fear in the hearts of a large majority of the intelligent though humbler citizens.
