As you may know, our organization is interested in bringing about better working conditions when we find them unfair and unsatisfactory. We are, therefore, anxious to have your organization cooperate with us in securing these conditions.

The League of Women Shoppers has just made a thorough investigation of the workers strike against the Cushman Bakery Co. We have found a long history of discrimination and unfairness of the company towards its union employees. Many of these employees have been discharged on false pretenses, and all attempts at collective bargaining have been forcibly discouraged. We will be glad to mail you a full report of this investigation if you desire further information.

In order to bring about an early settlement of this strike, we are asking our members to support us by signing and sending the enclosed card to the employer, and by pasting the enclosed stamps on all outgoing mail. We believe these methods will be effective in bringing about a conciliation between the Cushman Company and its employees.

Would you help us by distributing these cards and stamps among your members, many of whom will be interested in helping. If you will let us know how many of these you can use, we will send them to you at once.
