I wrote Saturday to Gilbert Grosvenor and have this morning a warm-hearted letter enclosing his and Mrs. Grosvenor's check for \$200.00 and one from Mr. LaGorce, Vice-President of the Society, for \$100.00. Mr. LaGorce knew the Kennans well and greatly admired them

Mr. Grosvenor asks about the Russian library and papers. Says that he thinks it was given several years ago to the American Geographical Society of New York and asks to be advised if there are any remaining Kennan books or papers. The first step would be, would it not, to find out just what she has to be disposed of and to discover, too, whether shea stockholder of the Harriman bank her property could be sold for her benefit. Could you find this out without disturbing Mrs. Kennan?
