Also full and interesting Revolutionary history compiled from original sources, such as order books, military Journals, etc., obtained by the author while a member and secretary of the two state commissions raised by Connecticut to acquire and lay out the Winter Quarters of Putnam's army in 1778, into the present Putnam Memorial Camp. This latter data embraces some matters of wide national interest, such as the founding of American Union Lodge of Free Masons in the army in Redding, early loyalist activity in the town and the efforts made to check it, the much discussed question whether Gen. Samuel Parsons and William Heron of Redding were in treasonable communication with the British that winter, (in which both Parsons and Heron will be vindicated,) the founding of Putnam Memorial Camp, etc., Church and school history will be fully treated, as well as the civil war period, and there will be a chapter on the recent discovery of the town by residents of neighboring cities, and a description of some of the beautiful homes they have built there. Portraits, views of houses, landscapes, etc., will be a feature of the work. The book will be a revision and enlargement of the author's earlier History of Redding, now out of print. It will be sold only by subscription, and as but few more copies than are subscribed for will be printed, the book will soon become rare and valuable.
