Dear Mr. Bjorkman:

I am sure that Mr. Landergren and Mr. Fettinger have reported that they delivered me safely at my house Monday evening.

I cannot tell you how grateful I am for your hospitality. You made the day very easy for me. And what a rich day I found it. As I tried to say at the lunch I have so long felt that there was a fine piece of Lincoln work unfinished in New Jersey. I had the will to do more about it, but not the way. And now I am so satisfied that you have taken the work over, dear Mr. Bjorkman.

I am having copied for you the little map I showed you Monday. It has marked on it Deborah's grave - Salter's House and Forge. I also have a long manuscript which Mr. Hutchinson wrote for me describing the section. I will have the pertinent paragraphs copied for you and send with the map. I feel sure that it will be useful in establishing sites and boundaries.

My little article in The Times is bringing me letters from interested people. I am enclosing a paragraph from one which has come to me from New Egypt which possibly may be of use in the investigations. If other material comes my way I shall be so glad to pass it on to you and you know how welcome any information will be to me which you may pass on.
