came. Please accept thanks for the same. At that time, I was preparing a brief paper on Lincoln, in the Black Hawk War. That paper was read before our Early Settlers' Club on the 15th. inst.

The secretary of the State Historical Society of this State, will include it in his forth-coming volume of collections. If you should desire a copy of it, I will forward you a copy when published.

The conclusion that I have reached is that the route of Mr. Lincoln indicated on your map, from Galena to Lake Koshkonong, is not correct, but that Lincoln accompanied Genl. Henry's Brigade from Dixon up the easterly side of Rock River through Beloit and through this city to Lake Koshkonong and Burnt Village.

I have worked out a probable itinerary of Mr. Lincoln in the war, to accompany the paper. If it should become desirable to you, to examine it, before it is printed, I can send you a copy of the manuscript. I shall be pleased to give you any assistance that I may, in getting at the facts.
