Lincoln, of Mifflinburg, Union County, Pennsylvania, to furnish you the information asked for in yours of 12th instant. I have received a letter from him giving a copy of his answer to you. The Hannaniah Lincoln, spoken of in the President's letter to Mr. R. V. B. Lincoln, was a son of Thomas Lincoln, who was a brother of John, the President's ancestor. You will find Annaniah's (or Hannaniah's) name on the record of survey of 400 acres of land owned by the Grandfather of the President, a copy of which is in the book you and Mr. J. McCan Davis wrote in 1896 and McClure published.
