At long last I can send you a detailed estimate of furniture for the Lincoln Room. The work of Schwegler and Company of Cleveland is estimated as follows:



To this must be added about \$300 for the metal drawer files which go under the standing desk at the west end of the room and about \$40 for a small cabinet catalogue of the books and items in the collection.

This comes close to exhausting the \$2,000 you have planned to contribute to the room without making provision for new radiators, the random-width wood floor, the refinishing of the woodwork, the painting of the ceiling and the cost of the murals. New radiators are practically a necessity, but we could economize for the current year by sanding and refinishing the present wood floor instead of replacing it.

I hope you will feel free to criticize the estimate. I can come to Oil City at your convenience to discuss anything that cannot be covered by a letter.
