Madam:

In reply to your letter of the 29th ultimo, I have to advise you that the application of Abraham Lincoln for bounty land warrant comprises two pages. Under the Act of August 24, 1912 a charge of 15 cents per page is made for making photographic copies of papers on file in this Bureau and 25 cents additional for certification if desired. If you will state the purpose for which the copy requested is desired, photographic copy of Mr. Lincoln's application for bounty land warrant may be furnished for thirty cents, or if certified, for 55 cents. Money should be forwarded by postal or express money order drawn to the order of the Secretary of the Interior.
