I have just returned from a three months' stay in Florida and I find that in my absence a second article which I had written on Mr. Wing's experiences as a news collector for Mr. Lincoln has been sold by my agent. I have done the best I could and I hope you will be satisfied. I only wish that Mr. Wing could have lived to know that you were going to receive a little from the work. But perhaps he knows all about it.
