My dear Miss Tarbell:

Many thanks for yours  
of the 8<sup>th</sup> inst.

I have a copy of Mr. Sincola's  
letter to David Humphreys dated Oct. 23, 1860.

I have seen a series of five  
letters from Sincola to Samuel Haysen  
— all published in the Gettysburg Edition  
but, no others. I imagine this number  
included the entire correspondence to  
Mr. Haysen.

The letters you mention of  
October 1858 to H. B. Tidd I have  
not seen and would be very glad of  
a copy. There are six letters from Sincola  
to Tidd as follows: two in November 1858,  
two in December 1859, and two in Feb-

ruary 1860 — all in the Gettysburg Edition.

I suppose the unpublished  
letters Mrs. Pickett has in her possession  
were addressed to her father — Saml Joseph  
Gulliver; but why did she not furnish  
you with copies for your appendix to  
your *Life of Sincola*? I hope the letters  
are interesting and important letters and  
that you succeed in securing copies for  
the *American Magazine* and *S. Thirty*, be  
benefited.

I am progressing very well in  
the work of collecting and have printed  
out half dozen letters in the hands of the  
descendants — grand children — of Saml  
Tidd Kremen, Mr Sincola's Minister to  
Spain succeeding Cecil Selwyn. There  
is a Spanish letter in Spanish, German  
which I may now be able to procure.

It is very interesting work to me  
and I am interested in every copy of letter
