Possibly you observed in Lincoln Lore No. 404, issued on January 4 the contemplated pilgrimage beginning at Boston on June 20 on the 300th Anniversary of Samuel Lincoln's arrival in America and continuing on consecutive days to the points touched by the Lincolns until they reached the Illinois country. This program now seems to be taking rather definite form and I think we will be able to follow through on it very much like it was originally anticipated.

I am wondering if it would be possible for you to attend any of the group meetings in either Boston, Hingham, or Freehold, New Jersey. We are planning a Lincoln breakfast at Boston on the morning of June 20, at which we hope to assemble most of the better known Lincoln students in New England, and try and perfect a New England Lincoln organization. We regret, of course, that this Anniversary date comes on Sunday, but we do not believe that most of the people would object to attending a breakfast on that morning.

I find how greatly under obligation we are to you with reference to this itinerary as I read over again your book on Lincoln, and recall also my pleasure in meeting you at Evansville when you were gathering material for the book.
