My dear Miss Tarbell:

As requested when you were here yesterday, copies have been made for you of a number of items from the scrap-book and from the Minutes of the Finance Committee, 1903 to 1908, which are attached.

In addition to the memorandum describing the first offering of stock to employes dated December 31, 1902, we are sending a copy of the latest memorandum of the same general character dated January 20, 1925.

The Dickson letter referred to in the Minutes of the Finance Committee for the meeting of April 24, 1906, has not been located, but search will be made in other old files.

Referring to your question whether a copy may be made of the scrip attached to Page 198 of the scrap-book, an unsigned \$10 note of the Oliver Iron Mining Company, on the back of which is marked in blue pencil in Judge Gary's handwriting "Save, 1907 Panic", I think there will be no objection to this being photographed, in which case perhaps both the front and the reverse should be photographed.

We are holding this in the scrap-book until you, or Mrs. McKeogh, inform us that it is desired by the engraver for reproducing.

A message from Mrs. Gary in Birmingham says that they are planning to start home on Sunday, which will probably bring them to New York on Tuesday morning.
