My dear Mr. Sites:

I find on looking over the pamphlets that you have sent me that I have not a complete file of the reports of the annual stockholders' meetings.

In volumes three and four of Judge Gary's Addresses I find his impromptu remarks made at these meetings in 1917, 1918 and 1919. I suppose these are all that are published. In the separate pamphlets sent me I have those for '21, '22, '23 and '24, but the first ('21) does not include "Remarks of Stockholders."

Could you finish out the file, making sure that wherever the remarks of stockholders were published that I have them? In one of the earlier pamphlets - I think as early as 1905 - there was an interesting episode which I have used more than once in talking, where one of the stockholders proposed to pray for the Company before disbanding, and Judge Gary was wise enough to let him go ahead. I do not find that pamphlet among my notes. I should be obliged if you will do what you can to make the set complete.

Thank you for your letter of May 8 with the answers to the questions in my letter of the seventh. I will bring that letter down the next time that I talk things over with Judge Gary and hold him to his promise to supplement your answers.
