My dear Miss Tarbell:

When we spoke to Judge Reed this morning about seeing you Saturday, he suggested ten o'clock so he might have a little more time to go over his accumulated mail. But upon learning that you had an appointment with Mr. Schiller at eleven, he said "All right, then perhaps Miss Tarbell had better come at 9:30."

He was wondering just what you would wish to know, and I said that of course you would have a number of questions.
