My dear Miss Tarbell:-

I have your letter of May 28th. Mr. Carlisle was not examined in Washington in connection with the propaganda investigation which the federal trade commission carried on. Nothing has come out in way of testimony official or otherwise relating to his newspaper campaign in Watertown. He appeared before the commission on revision of the public service law of New York state. I send you herewith copy of a portion of his testimony before that commission. That was largely a cut and dried investigation you will note by the testimony. I also send you a memorandum which I found in the files having to do with the water power fight which was really the Concord-Lexington of the broader power fight now going on. *over*
