Dear Miss Chandler:

Saturday night in our talk, so stimulating and suggestive to me, you spoke of Mr. Young having had reproduced the Custer document, around which he built the talk he hoped to give to the test boys at Schenectady. I think I said to you that I would like very much to get a copy of the reproduction if one was available. I am wondering, too, if any notes were made of the speech which Mr. Young had in mind and if so I could get hold of them. I think I told you how much interested I have been in the evident satisfaction that he gets from contacts with young men - his evident faith that putting in more development is about as good a thing as he can do. I want to find an illustration of this and I have come across nothing better than what you told me about the proposed Christmas night talk to the test boys and his pleasure in preparing for it. There is a double reason for this story - it gives a chance to explain the test boy and the training that he gets at Schenectady - a very fine thing in itself.

Can you help me in the matter?

I did enjoy our talk Saturday night. I hope you will come again.
