Dear Mr. Blossom:

I understand that you are to submit the editing of the first article to me before publication. I have certain changes of my own of which we talked to insert.

Thank you for writing out so clearly what you would like done in the second and third articles. I shall of course keep these suggestions in mind; and it would be a good idea to talk over the third article a little more fully before I go ahead with it.

Since you want to stay clear of the work Young did abroad on Reparations, would there be any objection to my publishing elsewhere an article on that subject or indeed on any other phase which you do not care to have taken up? It being understood that I did not submit anything elsewhere until after your articles are out of the way and that I do not use in them any material or argument which appears in yours. I am not at all sure that I will have the time or inclination to do this for book chapters are rarely magazine articles; but in case I should see something would you object of my going ahead with it? Really I do not see why you should for it is understood that you get the first whack at what I have.
