

Young - Labor Policy:

In the letter under head of July 2nd, Mr. Crocker suggests that I see Mr. Rice about Young's connection with the labor strike in the years just after he entered G.E. Crocker mentions Lynn particularly, says nothing of Erie. I have written him that my best plan would probably be to go to Schenectady and follow the thing through, that is, I take it that the outline of labor story should be -

1 - Y's. notions on labor when he entered the G.E. There I have the Chandler interview. Have never considered it, etc., etc.

2 - The shock he got when he learned the attitude of the Company.(see the Chandler interview for this)

3 - The settlement, at least the handling, of the Lynn and Erie strikes.

4 - His attitude towards labor after he entered the War. What was done in the G.E.

5 - Talk with him, if possible, about the first industrial conference and the reason it failed. This, I think, is important. better go over my own notes on that conference, ^{give my impressions and} possibly write them out, and ask him to talk them over with me.

6 - The Unemployment Conference - the whole story.

7 - What was done in the G.E. to carry out the suggestions of the ^{Committee on Business Cycles} best example, so far as I know, excepting perhaps
