

My dear Miss Tarbell:

In view of the fact that you held the first Honnold lectureship at Knox College and have written about Lincoln, it is not necessary for me to tell you about the Centenary celebration of the college in 1937, or of the plans for dedicating Old Main hall as a National Historic Site in memory of the Lincoln-Douglas debate held there. We do, however, want you to serve as a sponsor for this celebration, and will appreciate official authorization from you.
