Dear Miss Tarbel,

I have never answered the letter I received from you shortly after my return from America this summer. I have found it very difficult to keep up with my correspondence as I have no regular stenographic help and my time is very much taken up with my office work.

I now have under press a little booklet "The Fascist Era, Year XV", of which I hope to send you a copy in two or three weeks' time. It will show you the recent developments in the Guild organisation which has given Italy a solution of the labour and industrial problems which are causing so much anxiety in many other countries.

I expect I shall be in New York some time in January and shall hope to find you at the National Arts Club where I shall probably stay for a few days before going on to Washington and New England. Arrangements for me to lecture on economic and social aspects of Italian life have been made by Dr. Previtali of the Italian Historical Society and I dare say he has informed you about the proposed

tour. I have not had any definite details myself but understand that they are going ahead with the programme.

This will reach you shortly before Xmas and I hope it will find you in good health. It brings you my very best wishes and warmest personal regards.
