Dear Brother

Not hearing from you for some time I thought I would write you a few lines to let you know how I get along the weather here is nice a warm it looks a little like rain to night this morning there was two soldiers come here from the Hospital to see Philip Yokum to tell him there was a friend there from the 150 Reg. that wanted to see him the fellows told me it was his brother and Philip was on Guard at the time but soon come off I told Phil the men wanted to see him they told him about the friend and said he had some of his Brothers things Phil. went right down with them and was very much surprized to find his brother Henry he was over joyed that he could not keep in his brother was wounded in the head going in over the right eye and out by the ear Com. K. got two months pay yesterday I will send it home soon by Sargeant Kepler I am well at present all the rest of the boys the same you must excuse my short letter and write soon from your brother.
