Dear Brother

I received yours on the 22nd and was glad to hear from you and liza also tell Billy bulley for the boy with the glays eye and red head just good for him if he would not go up the day to get exemped if he had to go through the examination that we did at Harrisburg striped and a Red for $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour I geys he would of went the day that was set to go I am glad Dan Fowler is D if there had been good many more like him it would of suited me just first rate how the Hell is it that old Lorkin can get Eliza's letters out of the post office has he had any children by that name since I left I made a mistake the last letter I wrote to Eliza and got Eliza Cutter I was glad when I heard from her.

Dear Sister

I received your letter the same day that I got George's and was glad to hear from you all and just as glad to of the drafted ones Bill along I am on guard today I have not been on guard since last Sat. news just come in the Baltimore Clipper that Island no 10 is taken by the Rebbles the boys are all well at present you can Mrs. Boggs that her husband is well I was down to the Reg. on Tuesday and met Bill Boggs and Ros going back to the Reg they had been to our Camp witch is 1.72 miles he said he was going to write when he got to his camp the nights are gettting here and our blankets are none to warm. Our overcoats are made like fathers. White one with the cape on and weighs over 5 pounds I have got 7 shirts and two pairs of drawers and draw 1 pair of shoes every 3 months so got to close, good by,
