"The Chicago Strike of 1894" was printed privately in 1895. The only copy I can find is one received then and belongs to my "copy" for the printer of the second or third volume of my brother's speeches and writings.

Probably I put a copy in the Library of Congress and perhaps one in the Astor Library (of that time) in New York City. I should think it likely that one was placed in each of several Chicago libraries, especially the Law Library.

If you wish to know his later impressions, I shall be glad to show you, the first time you are here, an envelope containing manuscript data, especially recollections, about the strike.
