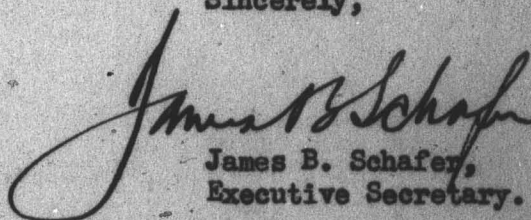
The Fund is a membership corporation organized under the laws of the State of New York.
