I have searched in the telephone
books of the period 1860 to 65 but
found no name in the Washington
books of the party who made the
daguerreotype photo in question.
Yet there is nothing conclusive
in that; as telephones at that peri-
od were not so universally used
or so popular; it may also be possible
that that party was not professional
but only an amateur photographer,
which is most likely the case here.
I have a very fine bust statue of in
white marble, about fourteen inches
or eighteen inches high, now for
sale; this has all the appearance of
being an original, certainly a real
desirable object; also a oil painting old

canvas portrait of medium size
of John Brown the abolitionist
and Emancipator - original, comes
from Virginia. Have the old
frame with it too, on historic portrait.
