Washington "D.C." Nov 7th / 63

Dear Brother

I received your letter
Yesterday and was glad to hear
from you I am well at Present
and I hope these few lines
will find you and the rest
of the folks the same. The weath^{er}
has been fine for the last weeks
and every thing goes very well
here we have every thing fixed
up in stile Bill did not have
a very big crop of corn I guess
he cant sell more than 50 bushels
this year out of 40 our corn was
Paid off. to day we were Paid
for 2 months Bill Byggs said he
was going Home and I thought I
would send 20 dols with him

Judge Pettis was here to day
every time he comes to Washington
he comes to see the Boys here
I like the City here better than
Soldiers Home there is more going
on. them Gloves answers the Purpo
very well Sunday the 8th I have just
come in from Inspection so though
I would write a few lines more
I got a letter from Sam just
now I think it will be some
time before I can write him an
answer if there is not more news
than I know at Present the
other day we bought a new wood
saw & wash board broom & so on I think
we are riged for winter give my
love to Grand Mother & the rest
of the folks how is Lisa and her
family getting along write soon
