Dear Dr. Schlesinger:

I have just returned to my desk and find waiting me your letter of April eleventh. I appreciate of course the pressure that this time of year brings on those in the academic world and am quite willing to await your time for criticisms and suggestions on my manuscript. I understand, too, that Mr. Fox will examine it.

The concluding chapter is ready to be whipped into final form. I hope to get it to you within a few days.
