Dear Mr. Bacon:-

We have at last arranged for the transfer of the plates and stock of Miss Tarbell's books, now in the hands of Doubleday, Page & Company, to us. I enclose you herewith a copy of their letter confirming our arrangement. I have accepted for Moffat, Yard & Company, and the transfer and contract between Doubleday and ourselves will follow in due time.

Meantime, you will note that Doubleday, Page & Company make this arrangement conditional upon being notified by you, as Miss Tarbell's lawyer, that it is satisfactory to her.
