Dear Miss Tarbell:

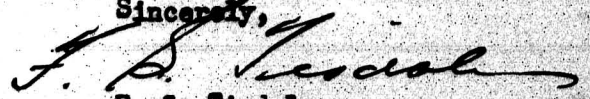
