My dear Miss Tarbell

Your letter of the 30th ult is just now at hand. The use you propose to make of the manuscript I sent you and the manner of doing ^{it} are entirely satisfactory to me. Enclosed I send you two changes I wish made in the manuscript. Both of them occur where I ^{am} speaking of Mr Lincoln's speech in "Mayor's Hall" I have copied the sentences which I wish taken out from the notes I used in preparing the sketch and they may not appear in the exact same form in the text of the manuscript. But you will find them so nearly if not exactly alike you will have no difficulty in finding the sentences I wish taken out and the places in which to insert the new matter in stead of that taken out. The longer ^{one} of the corrections I am quite desirous should be made. The shorter one is not of much importance and if you do not readily find the sentence to be taken out, you need not spend much time

in looking for it. Both sentences to be taken out
out occur near together. If it is not too much
trouble I would regard it as favor to be advised
whether you can make the corrections indicated.
