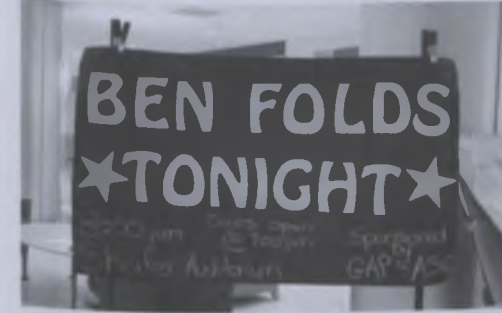

## Service

### Alternative Spring Break:

"ASB" trips are weeklong issue-focused trips in March that give students service experiences in other parts of the country. More than 60 students participate each year, and many return wanting to do more service in Meadville. Trips this year include: Baltimore, MD to work with Civic Works renovating vacant lots and

abandoned buildings; Boston, MA with Volunteers of America working with the elderly and at-risk youth populations; Columbus, OH working with The Open Shelter to reach out to the homeless population; and Greensboro, NC to build a house with Habitat for Humanity.

### Collegiate Leadership Conference:

"CLC" is an intensive 5-day leadership conference in August focusing on Self, Community, and Impact. More than 60 students attend each year. A service day with six different projects assisting area agencies is included. Reflection on the service experience and a connection with leadership is an integral part of this conference.

### Make a Difference Day:

More than 700 Allegheny students join 700 Crawford County residents each year on a Saturday in October to complete over 125 cleaning, building, and repair projects in the local community. Neighbors help neighbors on this day, rain or shine.

### Community Service Programs:

Other programs offered by Community Service: America Reads Program, Bonner Leaders Program, Clearinghouse of Immediate Needs, Gill Village Computer Literacy Program, Meadville Community Soup Kitchen, Allegheny Service Leader Program, and Bonner Scholars Program.

### Service Events:

Additional service events offered by Community Service: Allegheny Service Adventures, An Introduction to Meadville, Senior Citizen Recognition Day, and the Children's Carnival.

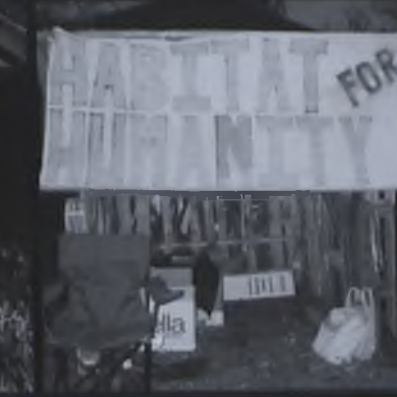
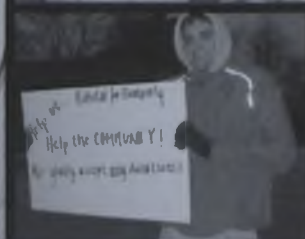

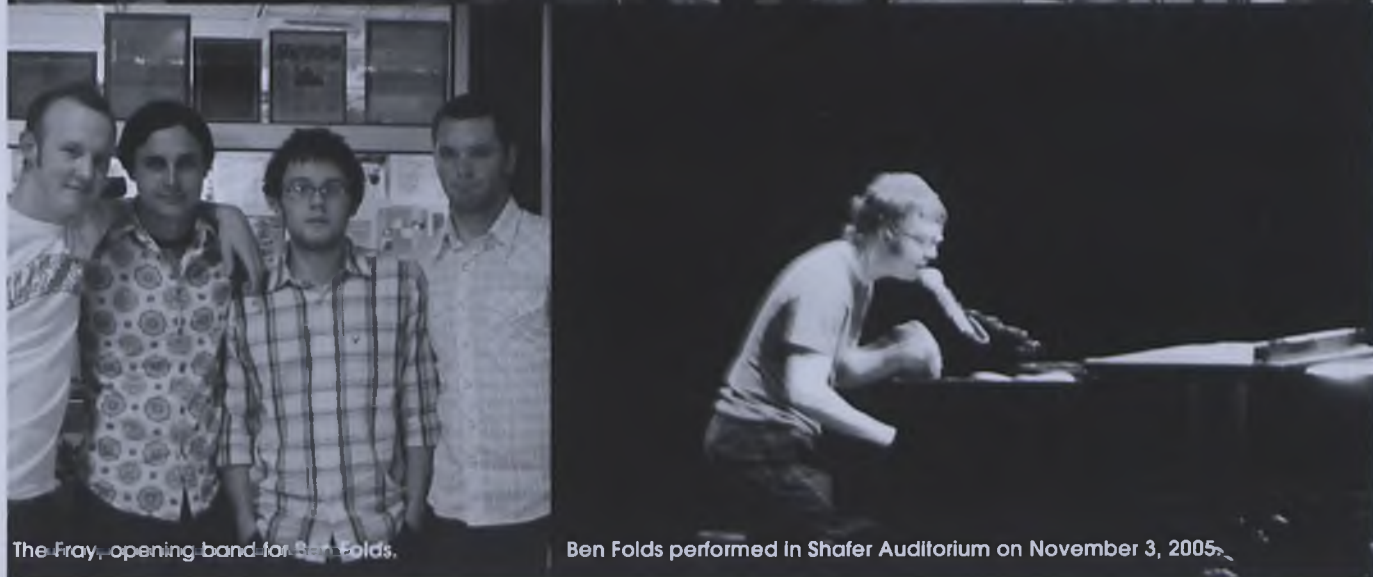

## Women's Rugby

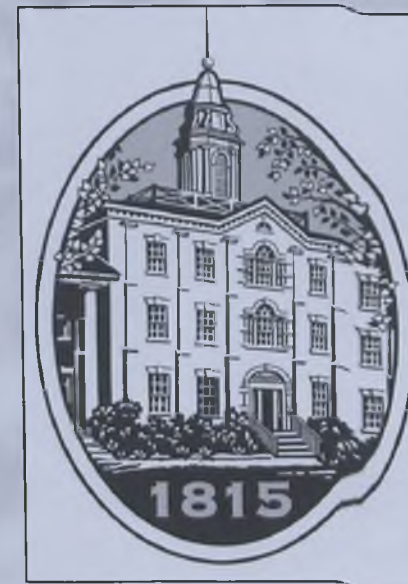

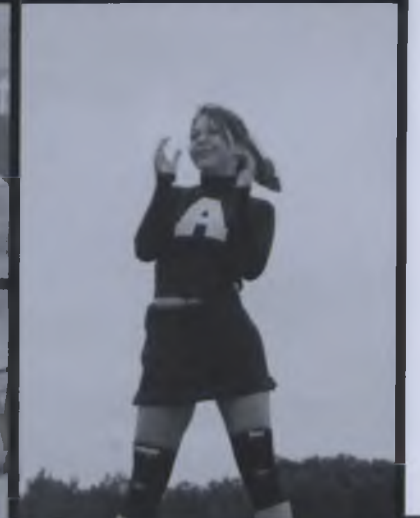

## Renovations and Projects



### COCHRAN HALL

Built in 1907 as a commons area for men, Cochran Hall was the College's most expensive structure to date -- \$60,000. The local press proclaimed it the finest dormitory at any American college at the time. Designed by architect Ed Tilton, it was of the Italian villa style, made of brick, with light terra cotta trimmings and tile roof. The first floor contained a reception hall, a main dining room, a smaller club dining room, a reading lounge, and kitchen facilities. On the second floor were study spaces, sleeping rooms, and baths. The basement housed four bowling alleys, shuffleboard courts, storage space and a YMCA activity room and office.

Beginning in 1955, Cochran Hall was used as the College Union until the opening of Henderson Campus Center in 1972. From 1972 until 2004 Cochran was home to the post office, the bookstore, the print shop, WARC radio station, the English department, and other administrative functions. In 2005, the building was totally restored to near-original condition to house the Patricia Bush Tippie Alumni Center.



### "READ BETWEEN THE SIGNS"

Standing between 7' - 10' tall, Read Between the Signs is a sculptural relief built from discarded road signs that surrounds and screens PennDOT's storage lot and will eventually span 1,200' x 730' have been completed to date. The project celebrates the landscape, environment and community of Crawford County and has come to represent a collective cognitive map of the landscape, architecture and community events that are most valued locally. Included are two kinetic elements -- a 10' Ferris wheel and a 20' section of stream complete with jumping fish-- both powered by recycled solar powered signboards. The Arts and Environment Initiative is an Interdisciplinary Minor administered by Professors Eric Pallant and Amara Geffen.



### ROBERTSON ATHLETIC COMPLEX

Allegheny will complete a major modernization and renovation of the Robertson Athletic Complex by fall of 2006. The renovated field will be named in honor of Frank Fuhrer, a graduate of the College and former trustee, whose generous gift along with donations by numerous other alumni and friends made the renovations possible. Renovations include: FieldTurf Playing Surface, the same surface used for Super Bowl XL, for varsity football, soccer, lacrosse and recreation; FairPlay scoreboard, utilizing the latest in LED lamp technology; 73' x 120' Soccer Field, field surface approved for FIFA and UEFA competition; and the 400-Meter Double Bend Olympic-Style Track, track installation by DeFargo, winners of the 2005 Outdoor Track Facility of the Year.



### NORTH VILLAGE

In fall 2006 Allegheny will open the North Village, a three-building residential complex of townhouse-style apartments. The North Village has been constructed with environmental sustainability in mind and will be LEED certified. The LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Green Building Rating System is a voluntary, consensus-based national standard for developing high-performance, sustainable buildings. The lead architects for the North Village worked with the thirteen students in Professor Eric Pallant's Junior Seminar on Sustainable Development to explore the most cost-effective, environmentally sound options for building the project. The three buildings include a total of 106 single bedrooms. Each suite of five bedrooms includes a shared living room, two full baths, and full kitchen facilities.

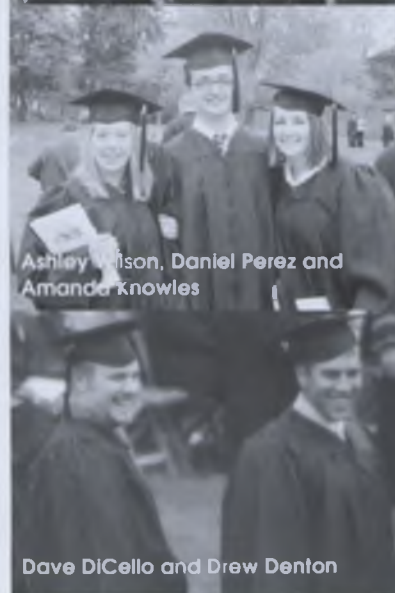
