Mr Lincoln boarded at Wm. Butters near to Dr. Hurrig's where
he boarded. The missing days from Jan. 12th to 14th Mr Lincoln
spent some hours each day at Dr. Hurrig's (His Physicians Dr. Hurrig
& Dr. Hurrig's) a part of these days I remained with Mr Lincoln
His most intimate friends had no fears of his injuring himself
He was very sad and melancholy, but being subject to these
spells, nothing serious apprehended. His being watched as stated
in London took time to me until I saw it there. I may
write you again on Monday. You will please acknowledge
recept of this.
