Dear Miss Wolfe:

We wish to acknowledge your letter of December 13, although we cannot yet give Miss Tarbell definite information about arrangements with the Radio Air Service Corporation for the use of her story, "He Knew Lincoln."

After receiving your letter of November 30, we wrote to Mr. H. Harold Gumm who has very kindly taken the matter up with the National Broadcasting Company. It is possible that the N. B. C. may not include the Cleveland station in the national hookup for the story and, if that is the case, it will be satisfactory to them to have the Radio Air Service Corporation use the story on the same night. In that event, Mr. Gumm has offered to confer with us regarding the terms for this permission.

According to Mr. Gumm's letter of December 10, he expects to hear within a few days whether or not our applicant will be able to present the story at all, since the director in charge for N. B. C. will then give him more information about the inclusion of the Cleveland station in the hookup. We shall certainly inform Miss Tarbell of any agreement that is proposed and if, in the meantime she herself has any suggestions, we shall be only too glad to have you communicate with us again.
