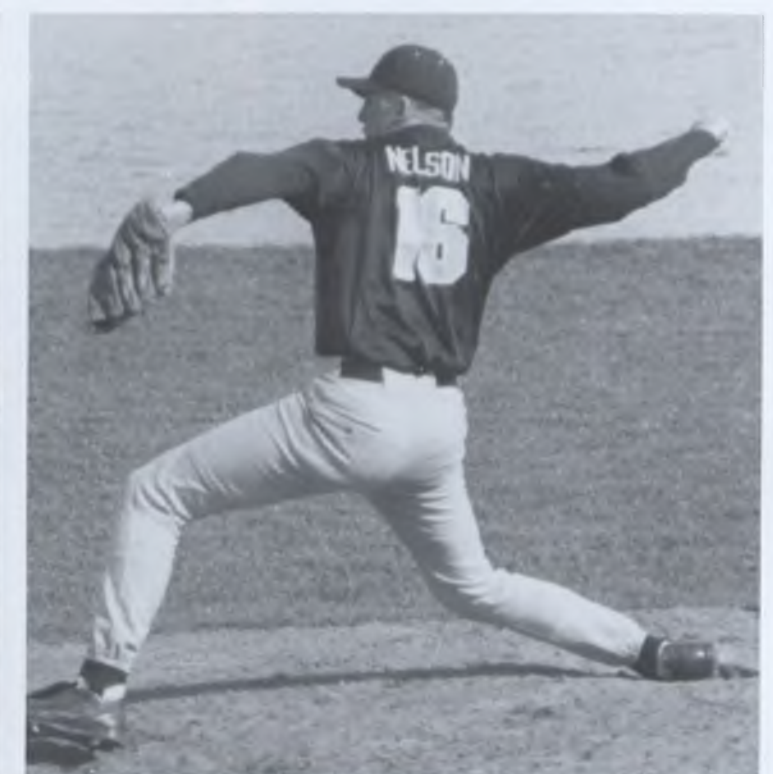

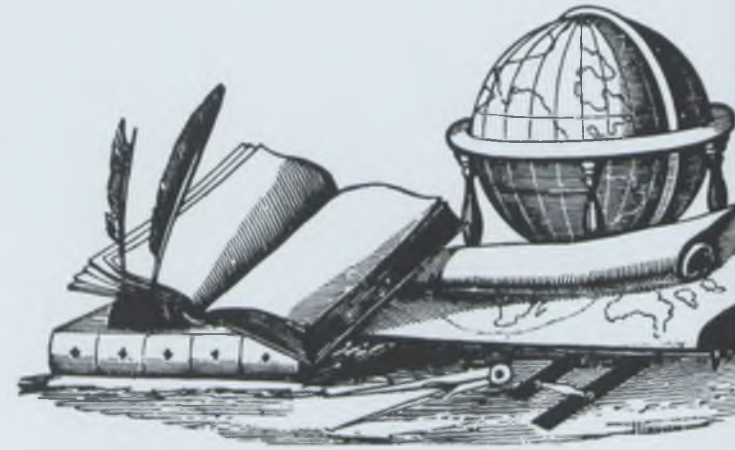
Organizations Not Pictured

And of course, had it not been for Walsworth Publishing and Ken Brayer, the yearbook would still be an abstract idea and would have not made it in print. The 1994 Kaldron has begun a future precedent for being student run, working against the odds and finally succeeding.
