Knowing from your recent writings, your views as to the way prohibition has failed in our country, I think I need only to call to your attention at this time the nation-wide organization -- The Association Against the Prohibition Amendment -- which is working to correct the evils brought upon our land by Volsteadism.

I am taking the liberty of sending you, under separate cover, some booklets and other literature which, if you have time to run through them, will give you some idea of what this organization is and what it is doing.

Recently, the Association has been reorganized and the National Board of Directors has been enlarged by the addition of many of the country's leading men in business and the professions and other lines. I would particularly call your attention to the list attached hereto which shows the Board of Directors so far as announced through the press. Other men of equal prominence are being added from time to time.

A part of the work which this Association is doing is through special organizations among the women of the country. The principle woman's organization is the National Voluntary Committee of Women.
