My dear Mr. Stafford:

Some weeks ago you wrote, asking where you could obtain certain Lincoln photographs. I have been much out of town and very busy and have neglected to answer. I hope you will pardon me.

For Bradley's Lincoln and Tad, write to the War Department, Washington, D.C. According to their old catalog this photograph is A-3144 + 5726. Of course this may have been changed, but they will find it for you.

If you will write to the guardian of the Lincoln Home, Springfield, Ill., I think he can probably tell you where you can get a picture of Lincoln's tomb, Anne Rutledge's grave, and of the Kirkham grammar. If you do not succeed in getting them there, it is possible that the publisher of my Life of Lincoln, Macmillan, 64 Fifth Avenue, New York City, might let you have a print or a cut of these pictures, though he would not have the original photographs.

As for the picture of Harriet Beecher Stowe, you ought to be able to get that from any publisher of a Life of Mrs. Stowe.

I hope this letter is not too late for your purposes, and will be of some service to you.
