

C O N T R A C T

Cleveland, Ohio, Dec. 9, 1915.

This Memorandum of an Agreement made and entered into this day by and between The Coit-Alber Chautauqua Company of Cleveland, Ohio, as Party of the First Part, and Ida M. Tarbell of New York, N. Y., as Party of the Second Part, Witnesseth:

That Party of the Second Part does hereby agree to fill lecture engagements, speaking once each day, Sundays included, for a period of not less than six (6) consecutive weeks, beginning approximately June 15, 1916, said engagements to be at Chautauqua Assemblies in Western Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Michigan.

That Party of the First Part agrees to arrange such speaking itinerary and, upon the fulfillment of the services herein agreed to be rendered, agrees to pay Second Party the sum of TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS for the above mentioned service, and, in addition, agrees to pay Second Party's necessary railroad fares beginning at New York City and ending at New York City, and the necessary pullmans. It is further agreed that this TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS shall be payable in six equal installments, an installment payable at the end of each week.

That Second Party agrees to furnish to First Party satisfactory photographs for publicity purposes and agrees to fill no Chautauqua engagements during the summer of 1916 except with the consent of First Party.
