I am in receipt every month of a check of \$32 since a year ago last June from an Old Age Security Fund. I do not know whether it is a government check or a city. Frank J. Taylor's name is on each check. I have felt each month I would like to thank some one for this help and as I saw your name on the list, I would like to show my appreciation to you. I am a widow since 1913 in my 87th year with one son, my only living relative, and my support, who is indeed worthy. We unite in prayer each day that God will help us through. I trust you will pardon the liberty I am taking and understand me.

I feel the weight of 86 years and I am not strong, so can only keep up our home with my son to help me when unemployed. I had a position for a while down town until I was over 70 years old, but now cannot be of any help.

May you be spared in health, and be rewarded as you so richly deserve for all you have done and may I not say God bless you!
