Vol. VIII, #2, of the publications of the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania has just been distributed to members. It contains a reprint of the early minutes of the Philadelphia Monthly Meeting, beginning with the year 1732, and refers to the Hank or Hanks family as follows:

1- Page 179- 30th of 6th month, 1734- "A certificate for John Hanks from Derby Monthly Meeting-----he being removed to this city to settle was read." 29th of 8th month, 1736- page 185- "John Hank made application for a certificate to Burlington Monthly Meeting respecting marriage."

2- Page 186- 28th of 11th month, 1736-7 John Hank asked to be excused without giving reasons for not proceeding with proposed marriage.

3- Page 188- 29th of 5th month, 1737- "A certificate for John Hank to Friends at Burlington, respecting his clearness in relation to marriage was signed."

You will notice that the name in the said minutes was spelled both Hanks and Hank. Evidently they were one and the same person. #
