
In reference to the enclosed contract I beg to say that I have only recently been able to see Mr. Mackenzie in regard to some of the particulars, and he suggests that the contract be made with the S. S. McClure Company, as The McClure Company is practically a dormant corporation.

He has also crossed out, as you will note, the words "per copy" where the contract reads "a royalty of fifty cents (50¢) per copy per set." The books are sold in sets, therefore, the words "per copy" are superfluous.

I have also made some changes in that portion of the contract referring to disposition of the stock on hand should we decide to discontinue sale of the publication. If the stock is to be disposed of it has to be as a whole. Therefore, Miss Tarbell, as called for by the contract, would have to take the entire stock on hand, or we would retain title to the entire stock. We would not care to divide the lot in that case.

If you will have these changes made, we trust that we will be able to have this matter straightened up.
