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## WHAT CAN WOMEN DO FOR PEACE?

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They must begin by recognizing that the world is divided between those who believe in War and those who believe in Peace. They must admit that while War is trained and equipped, knows exactly what he wants and is always on the job, Peace is little better than a talkative Mollycoddle, strong only in good intentions.

If Peace is to displace War she can do it only by a machinery as scientific as is War's Navy, Army, Air Fleet, Fortifications.

The machinery of Peace is diplomacy, a Hague Tribunal, a League of Nations, Peace Societies. They have proved inadequate, but are no more to be scrapped for that than an Army defeated in the field. War re-organizes, corrects, re-equips his defeated Army. So must Peace her defeated machinery.

Like War she must begin with the child. As he trains to love of arms, hate of alien races, indifference to

pledges, she must train to self-control, consideration of others, passion for justice, contempt for greed and jealousy, sense of the sacredness of obligations, and the duty to sacrifice and die if necessary for those obligations.

Let women gird themselves for such training<sup>and</sup> they will pass over a youth fit for the manning of a strengthened Peace machinery, based on the sacredness of treaties and equipped to see that their violation by force or indirection never goes unpunished.
