Dear Mr. Murray:

Would I be right in saying that without steel sheets such as you make at Middletown now it would be impossible to produce the present cheap refrigerator? I saw them made at Mansfield from steel plates which I was told came from Middletown. Are there any figures which show the difference in cost which your continuous process of rolling steel has made in the refrigerator?

Or would you rather that I put this question to the Westinghouse people at Mansfield? In a little editorial I am writing I want to refer to the development of the continuous process of steel rolling and to show how it justifies itself in cheaper goods for people who otherwise could not afford such a thing as a refrigerator, for example.

I am afraid I am troubling you a good deal and I do appreciate the courtesy of your answers.
