Dear Miss Youless:

I am sending, by this mail, a sheet of manuscripts that I have put in this shape to be published in book form.

I had thought of revising them for you; but I am not in very good health, so I am leaving them for you to select from them what you want and drop the rest into the scrap basket.

The enclosed letter needs an explanation: When I was writing "A Latin Literal Tragedy", I wrote to Dr. Benton, to verify Seneca's forecast; and I got this reply.
