Lincoln Memorial University is dedicating its Civil War Library on October 17. We have found it necessary to establish this special library to supplement our famous library on Abraham Lincoln. Dr. Robert L. Kincaid has taken it as his special project, and the Class of 1942 has accepted it as their memorial to the University.

While we have not as yet worked out all the details we do know that Stanley F. Horn, author of "The Army of Tennessee," will be the main speaker for the Saturday celebration, which will begin at 3:00 P.M. There will be a Saturday afternoon, Saturday evening, and Sunday morning celebration.

Sunday morning our speaker will be Captain Harry S. Howard, son of General Oliver Otis Howard who founded the University.

Those who plan to come to the celebration and are not driving can reach us by taking the L & N either from Louisville or Cincinnati to Corbin, Kentucky. We will meet any such guests by car at that point and drive them to the University. Those coming from the East can take the Pennsylvania and Southern out of New York and Washington to Morristown, Tennessee, and we will meet such guests at that point.

We are planning a very interesting program, and we hope it will be possible for you to be present. Stanley Horn will speak on the subject, "Hood's Tennessee Campaign." Here is a speaker who can never make a dry speech.

We are looking forward to the pleasure of greeting you on this occasion. Please put this date in your calendar and write us that you are coming.
