I had already discovered, I think through you, that it was the Lincoln Chalked Hat letter used at the Test Men's Dinner. I have a facsimile of the letter but I have not yet Mr. Young's permission to use it. Can you get that for me? It is a fine story.

I am sending to you with this letter items that belong in your file - First, the Lewisohn pamphlet, Russia - The Industrial Laboratory. Someday I want to talk to Mr. Young about it - it so falls in with certain things that I heard him say at Chandler.

I am also returning five newspaper clippings on the workings of the General Electric unemployment scheme.

I am returning, too, the clipping from the Evening Post of April 16th - Gilbert's comment on the talk of Mr. Young as President.

How about it? Could you could come up to the Pen & Brush Club, 16 East 10th Street, next Wednesday evening at six thirty? Perfectly informal and if it would suit you better to stop at the Club on your way up town you could rest there until I got in, probably about six fifteen. *for dinner*
