Meanwhile, it would be well for you to suggest to Mrs. Brookfield that she discuss her situation with the secretary-treasurer of the nearest production credit association, which probably is the Midland Production Credit Association, Midland, Texas, of which Mr. Hugh C. Barnes is secretary-treasurer. The production credit associations make loans for the purchase of cattle for restocking purposes, and her local association may be able to help her.
